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The "WINDOW TO THE PATIENT'S BRAIN" is the neurological examination. A neuro exam is a series of tests and observations that reflects the function of various parts of the brain.

The neurologic history and physical examination are the most important tools in neurologic diagnosis. Although confirmatory laboratory data, including modern imaging techniques such as CT scanning and magnetic resonance imaging, have provided further accuracy in neurologic diagnosis, the history and physical examination remain the mainstays.

The formal neonatal neurological examination should begin with an assessment of the level of alertness. This is perhaps the most sensitive of all neurological functions because it is dependent on the integrity of several levels of the central nervous system (see later).

A neurological examination assesses motor and sensory skills, hearing and speech, vision, coordination, and balance. It may al-

so test mental status, mood, and behavior. The examination uses tools such as a tuning fork, flashlight, reflex hammer, and a tool for examining the eye.
